



YOUR ESSENTIAL GUIDE TO THE Community Bus



What services are on offer?

The Community Bus service was launched in 2013 to improve the public transport available to the community, reducing isolation particularly for those with limited mobility.

With restricted local transport links in the area as well as the increasing importance of sustainability there has never been a better time to use the Community Bus!

There are a number of timetabled and door to door services available, all operating from our fully accessible vehicle purchased in April 2021.

timetabled services

The timetabled service runs between Hook railway station and the Meadows Camberley on Monday and Wednesday mornings. Please see the full timetable on page 5.

Timetabled service tickets cost £1.50 per single journey within the Parish. All destinations outside of the Parish cost £3 per single journey. Tickets are purchased by contactless card when boarding the bus.

Concessionary bus passes can be used on timetabled services.

In order to manage the number of people travelling on the bus, passengers must book by telephone 48 hours in advance by contacting the Community Bus Administrator on 01252 849712, Monday to Friday, 9am - 1pm.

The Community bus runs free trips to the Hart Pantry in Yateley.

Door to door services

Is the nearest bus stop too far away for you to get to? Or is there no bus service for you to use when you need to travel? If the answers to these questions is yes, the door to door services are for you!

We will collect you from your home address, take you to your destination and then drop you back home afterwards. You must register for the service with Hartley Wintney Parish Council.

All door to door services cost £4.50 per return journey. Concessionary bus pass holders will be entitled to a discount fare of £3.00 per return journey when showing their pass.

Tuesday Mornings - Fleet Town Centre

Pickup starts at 9.30am depending on where you live. Departure at 12.30/1pm.

Thursday Mornings - Morrison's Elvetham Heath and Fleet Town Centre

Pickup starts at 9.30am depending on where you live. You will have 1 hour in Morrisons or 2 hours in Fleet. This service is primarily for Hartley Wintney residents.

1st and 3rd Friday of the Month - Basingstoke Town Centre

Pickup starts at 9.30am depending on where you live. Departure at 12.30/1pm.

2nd Friday of the Month - The Meadows Camberley

Pickup starts at 9.30am depending on where you live. This service is primarily for Hartley Wintney residents.

4th Friday of the Month - Reading Town Centre

Pickup starts from 9.30am depending on where you live. Departure at 12.30/1pm. At present, the Reading service does not operate a discount for concessionary bus pass holders.

All pickup times are approximate times depending on passenger numbers.

To use these services, you need to register for the Community Bus and book your seat on your chosen door to door service by contacting the Community Bus Administrator on: 01252 849712



What is the Hartley Wintney Community Bus Service?

FAQS

The Community Bus is run by Hartley Wintney Parish Council, now in conjunction with Rosie Minibus Organisation. It is a locally owned and operated not-for-profit service to support residents and local organisations within the Parish who would otherwise not have access to transport.

Who can use the Community Bus?

The timetabled services are open to all Hartley Wintney, Hook, Yateley, Frogmore and Blackwater residents.

Door to door services are available to those with limited mobility or for use where there are no other public transport options available.

All passengers must be registered and book in advance.

Are dogs allowed on the bus?

Only 'Assistance' dogs are permitted on the bus. Please advise the administrator when you book your travel.

How do I register for the Community Bus?

Registration is free - register online using the online form on our website: **www.hartleywintney-pc.gov.uk** or scan the QR code to take you directly to the form.



Fares must be paid by contactless card on the bus for each trip.

Concessionary bus passes may be used on the timetabled services and holders will be eligible for a discount on the door to door services.

Do I need to book my trip before travelling?

Yes - you need to pre- book with a minimum 48 hours notice. Drivers are not permitted to carry passengers who have not made a booking. To book, call the Community Bus Administrator between 9am and 1pm, Mon-Fri on 01252 849712.

Can children travel on the bus?

Our bus has individual seat belts and there are regulations about the safe transportation of children. Contact the Bus Administrator for more details.

Can I travel with my wheelchair?

Yes, if you can transfer on your own and your wheelchair can fold then we can safely transport it in the bus. If you wish to travel seated in your wheelchair, please advise the Parish Office at least 72 hours in advance so that the necessary checks can be made to ensure your wheelchair meets the required safety standards for being secured in the bus.

The Precept

Hartley Wintney Parish Council Accounts:

The Parish Council receive a portion of resident Council Tax, called the Precept. Budget calculations are planned and agreed within Council meetings in January of each year. The Precept is calculated using a tax base, which relates to a Band D property (or equivalent).

For the previous three years, Hartley Wintney tax base was at £77.00 per year however due to increased costs and responsibilities, the Parish Council allowed for a £47,000 shortfall in 2021/22 to be funded from our general reserves. This is unfortunately not a sustainable approach and therefore, it was agreed that to continue to deliver the services to the community, an increase in the Precept for 2022/23 was required.

The tax base for this year will be approx. £91.00 per year (£1.75 per week) of your total council tax contribution per Band D property, equating to an increase of £1.18 per month. Our investments in significant community assets such as the Lucy Pygott Centre and the new Community Bus have reduced our overall reserves to a figure in line with the levels recommended by our Auditors.
