


HVA MEMBERS' (NON-CHRISTMAS) NEWS

Fleet u3a is for anyone not in full-time employment or no longer raising a family who wants to meet like-minded people and share social and learning opportunities. We cover Fleet, Church Crookham and surrounding areas and we currently have around 1600 members.

We have about 100 interest groups ranging from Art to Spanish, Family History to Science and Bridge to Jazz. There's a full programme of events and trips and a monthly meeting with a guest speaker. All this for a membership fee of £14 a year. We welcome all new members and we are especially keen to find to new volunteers to help run groups and activities. Hook Books is every 1st Thursday of the month from 2-4pm in the Elizabeth Hall RG27, Raven Road, Hook 9HH. All paperbacks are just 50p! It has also become a very popular monthly get together for villagers to meet up with friends and enjoy homemade teas. A slice of Louise's delicious homemade cake is just £1.50.

As well as thousands of paperback fiction books at Hook Books in the Elizabeth Hall, you can find a bookcase full of books (not children's books) which a volunteer regularly top-ups, behind the tills in Tesco (Hook) all month long. Again, all books are

just 50p! At Tesco we sell all our hardback fiction and non-fiction books plus paperback fiction at the honesty box bookcase.

If you need children's books during the month these are available in the permanent children's bookcases in the Elizabeth Hall and Hook Community Centre, which are again topped up regularly by volunteers. Children's books are just 20p each or 3 for 50p. Donations of books can be dropped off any weekday morning (9am-Noon) when the Elizabeth Hall is open. We use or recycle all donated books for the benefit of the Elizabeth Hall.

GO TO E-BIKES AND TRISHAWS COME TO HARTLEY WINTNEY

Hartley Wintney has been selected as one of three sites across Hampshire for a pilot scheme designed to tackle loneliness in people of all ages. GO TO, which is backed by the Good Neighbours Network - the county's thriving community support network - enables volunteers to deliver small items of food or medicine throughout the village on electric bikes and offer a Tri-shaw ride scheme.

Funded by the Department of Transport's "Tackling Loneliness with Transport" initiative the programme doesn't just ensure trained volunteers can get around the community quickly and easily, but also allows them to spend time with people who may be felling lonely or isolated. As well as delivering essential items, the volunteers are actively encouraged to take the time to have a chat, make sure people are warm enough through the winter months and that their needs are met. Thanks to the added pedal power of the electric bikes, those volunteers can be of all ages and aren't just limited to the super-fit!

WARM PLACES IN HAMPSHIRE



Across the country, community venues are opening their doors to provide "Warm Hubs" or "Warm Places". In Hart, both Fleet and Yateley Libraries are part of the **Warm and Welcome at Hampshire Libraries** initiative.

Each week there will be times where anyone can join others for free activity, such as board games, or to enjoy a hot drink and make use of the free wi-fi. Please ask any of the Library staff for more information, or look out for more information like the publicity on the left.

Fleet Library is also operating a coat exchange. Bring in a clean coat in good condition (children's or adults) and look for the clothes rail. If there are coat hangers available, you may leave a coat, and you are welcome to take one in exchange.

Look out for the Chat About logo. From November onwards, regular sessions in Hampshire libraries will offer a warm and safe space for people to come together and chat. Chat About tables will offer activities and conversation starters with opportunities to learn and try new things.



As we go to press, organisations involved in the Hartley Wintney Community Hub are planning to offer a warm place each weekday in a different venue in Hartley Wintney and Heckfield. Please look out for more information or contact <u>Hart Voluntary Action</u> for more detail. A "Warm Space" at St John's Church has already opened. Monday afternoons 15.00-18.00 - all ages welcome. Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult.

Hampshire County Council Grants for Warm Places

In mid-October, Hampshire County Council announced that the Leader's Grant programme would be made available for funding applications to create warm spaces in the county. Leader of Hampshire County Council, Councillor Rob Humby, said: "While households have been given a level of assurance that fuel bills will be contained to April 2023 for now, we know that many will still struggle significantly, facing exceptionally difficult choices about how budgets are spent this autumn and winter.

"As the colder months approach, we want to do what we can to support our local communities. We are therefore now inviting voluntary and community organisations to apply for a grant of up to £5,000 to develop and host warm hubs where people can gather together. This might be in the form of a regular coffee morning, or the provision of a shared activity, however we welcome creative ideas and concepts that will deliver support especially to our most vulnerable residents."

Applications are open for the financial year 2022/23. Those wishing to apply can find more information and guidance on the Leader's Community Grants web page. Any organisation wishing to apply for a grant to deliver a warm hub will also need to confirm that they will register on the Warm Welcome website.

COST OF LIVING

Citizens Advice organisations in Hampshire have come together to provide additional support around energy bill support for older residents by providing Energy Vouchers for over-65s. Citizens Advice Hart are offering a Household Support Energy Voucher scheme for older persons. Many households are eligible for a £147 voucher towards energy bills. All that is needed is the following proof:

Photo ID. Proof of address. Energy bill. Photo of meter. Photo of proof of benefit received, including state pension.) There are no other specific criteria. Citizens Advice Hart are targeting older people 65+ struggling to pay energy bills (but anyone is welcome to apply.) People can apply for this if they are a Hampshire resident and should contact their local Citizens Advice - citizensadvicehart.org.uk/contact/





Sustainable Warmth Grants for households

There is still time for Hart residents whose gross household income does not exceed £30,000 per annum or who are in receipt of an eligible benefit to apply for a Sustainable Warmth Grant towards home energy efficiency improvements, such as; Insulation, Low Carbon Heating and Solar PV. Your home must also have an energy efficiency rating of D, E, F or G.

Government-funded Sustainable Warmth grants are designed to support those households most impacted by rising energy bills. Check if you are eligible by going to this link.

It is our understanding that residents living in rented properties can also apply, but please do use the eligibility check. Grants of up to £10,000 are available.

The **Environment Centre** is funded by Hampshire County Council to provide their **Hitting the Cold Spots** information and advice service, which includes: Helping clients access funding, where available, for boiler repairs/replacements and other heating methods, insulation and renewable technologies. Providing temporary electric heaters if clients are without heating. Checking client eligibility for the Warm Home Discount and local energy efficiency schemes. Energise Me - Investing in Communities Fund

Energise Me and Sport England are offering support for Hampshire and Isle of Wight communities most affected by COVID-19 and/or the cost of living crisis. Community groups/organisations can access expertise and funding of up to £10,000.

Physical activity boosts wellbeing and reduces our risk of developing major illnesses by up to 50%. Energise Me and Sport England want everyone to enjoy these benefits. But some communities are less likely to take part in regular physical activity than others. COVID-19 research shows the pandemic has widened these inequalities, and the cost of living crisis is likely to make matters worse.

Hampshire County Council - Waste Prevention Community Grant Fund

Waste prevention is taken to encompass any actions which prevent or reduce the amount of **household** waste entering the local authority waste management system, and therefore includes: reuse, repair and home composting. In addition to the environmental benefits of reducing household waste, waste prevention projects can also result in financial savings for residents, community benefits (e.g. volunteering opportunities) and health benefits (e.g. household management, healthy eating). Applications for funding are open now and will close at 5pm on 10 January 2023. Funding for successful applications will be awarded from March 2023. The maximum amount awarded to each project will be £5,000.
